In spring 2022, the world's first museum dedicated to the work of the psychiatrist C.G. Jung (1875-1961) and his closest collaborators, the analysts Marie-Louise von Franz (1915-1998) and Barbara Hannah (1891-1986), was opened. At the heart of the exhibition is the illustration of the natural process of individuation, the experience and conscious realization of the antinomous Self in life. This is illustrated by means of series of psychic images from dreams, visions, active imaginations, and spontaneous fantasies.

The visit is without a guided tour, the exhibits can be viewed freely (it is not allowed to take photos.).

At the end of the tour there will be a discussion with Emmanuel Kennedy-Xypolitas, Dr. phil, psychotherapist and Training Analyst at the C.G. Jung Institute Zurich; he is founding member of the Swiss Foundation Museum for Analytical Psychology, initiator and director of the “C.G. Jung Museum”.
