The Swiss Federal Institute of Technology (ETH) Zurich University Archives is home of the C.G. Jung Papers Collection. The scientific personal papers of the founder of analytical psychology were bequeathed to ETH Zurich in his will.

The C.G. Jung Papers Collection includes

- 1. More than 32,000 letters to and from C.G. Jung
- 2. Around 1000 manuscripts
- 3. Extensive press archive with newspaper articles about C.G. Jung
- 4. Special print collection of publications by other authors, as well as a collection of studies by various authors on analytical psychology
- 5. Additions to the collection through acquisitions: e.g. original correspondence between C.G. Jung and Sigmund Freud as well as between C.G. Jung and Victor White

During the IAAP Conference the ETH University Archives offers guided tours with originals from the C.G. Jung Papers Collection. You will have the opportunity to look at the original correspondence between C.G. Jung and Sigmund Freud. In addition, manuscripts and letters are used to illustrate Jung's theories on the subject of "addiction and spirituality". Some of Jung's psychoanalytic theories deal with the relationship between the unconscious and spirituality. In this context, the consumption of mind-altering substances played an important role for Jung.
