Museum C.G. Jung House, Seestrasse 228, 8700 Küsnacht

The former residence of Carl Gustav Jung and Emma Jung-Rauschenbach is a place of remembrance of extraordinary presence. The house, as well as the gardens, bear the distinctive signature of C.G. Jung and reflect significant facets of his personality.

The house is both a scholarly house as well as a domestic museum, granting visitors a sense of the hospitality and work of C.G. and Emma Jung-Rauschenbach and allowing them to catch a glimpse of their scholarly and family life.

The museum is about ten minutes on foot from the Jung Institute and open to the public during the times indicated. The house and garden are still used privately today. Please respect the privacy of the residents and don't enter the grounds outside museum opening hours.

How to get to the museum:

The city train S6 or S16 from Zurich Main Station or Zurich Stadelhofen to Küsnacht ZH takes around 10 minutes. From there it is a fifteen-minute walk along the main road (Seestrasse) in the direction Rapperswil / Erlenbach.

Boats to Küsnacht leave Zurich from the ferry pier at Bürkliplatz. They take about 35 minutes. From the jetty in Küsnacht Heslibach it is a five-minute walk in the direction Zurich.
